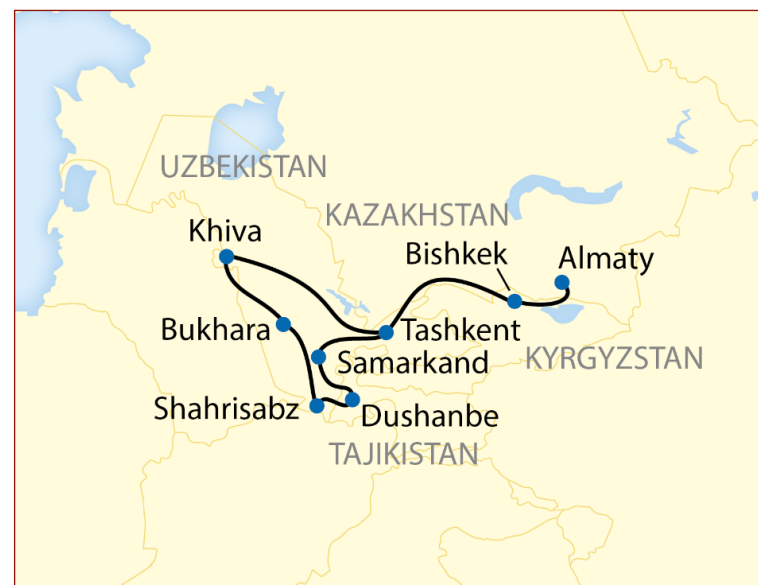

DAY 1

ALMATY

START YOUR TRIP OFF IN KAZAKHSTAN

Depending on your flight connection, arrival in Almaty during the day and transfer to your centrally located hotel. Your room is ready for check-in around 3pm.

Note: If extra nights are required pre-trip we recommend asking us to book them through the train operator as they do not confirm the actual hotels until around 6 weeks before the start of the trip.

Did you know? Almaty derives its name from "alma," which means "apple" in Kazakh. The region is believed to be the ancestral home of the apple, and the wild apple species *Malus sieversii* is native to the surrounding area. This lends the city the nickname "City of Apples."

START YOUR TRIP OFF BY VISITING SOME SCENIC SPOTS

After a morning of relaxation, you will meet your tour guides and fellow travellers in the afternoon.

Note: Some passengers may arrive early this morning depending on their flight connections. If you do arrive early today your room and breakfast will be ready for you.

An impressive start to your voyage is a trip to Medeo, where the highest ice-skating rink in the world is located. From here, you take the cable car to a ski resort at 2,200 m and continue to the Talgar peak at 3,200. You enjoy the crisp air and the breath-taking view before ending the day with a welcome dinner.

Did you know? Almaty is set against the stunning backdrop of the Trans-Ili Alatau mountains, part of the Tien Shan range. The city's dramatic setting not only provides picturesque scenery but also a variety of outdoor activities such as hiking, skiing, and ice skating, particularly at the nearby Shymbulak Ski Resort.

EXPLORE THE CITY BEFORE BOARDING THE TRAIN

In the morning, a city tour with Russian Orthodox wooden cathedral, wedding palace, circus and central mosque (from the outside). Lunch at the local yurt restaurant. In the afternoon, your journey with the special train begins. A welcome drink and a short lecture await you on board.

ISSYK KUL LAKE

TRAIN ACROSS THE STEPPE & VISIT THIS STUNNING LAKE

This morning you will reach the breathtaking Issyk Kul Lake. A visit to the Center of Nomadic Culture will bring you closer before you have time for a walk, or perhaps a small swim in the Issyk Kul. After a boat trip on the Issyk Kul, your train makes its way to Bishkek.

Did you know? Issyk-Kul is the second largest saline lake in the world, after the Caspian Sea, measuring about 182 kilometres (113 miles) long and 60 kilometres (37 miles) wide. Despite being surrounded by snow-capped mountains and located at an altitude of over 1,600 meters (5,249 feet), Issyk-Kul never freezes. This is due to its slight salinity and the geothermal activity beneath its surface, which keeps the water relatively warm.

EXPLORE THE CAPITAL OF KYRGYZSTAN

After breakfast on board you will reach the Kyrgyz capital Bishkek. On a tour, you will discover their numerous sights. With about 100m² of green space per inhabitant, Bishkek is one of the greenest cities in the world! And of course the Ala-Archa National Park is also part of the programme. You spend the night in a comfort hotel in Bishkek.

Did you know? Bishkek showcases a strong Soviet architectural influence, reflected in its wide boulevards and extensive use of marble in public spaces. Many buildings, including government offices and cultural institutions, exhibit the grand, blocky style typical of mid-20th century Soviet architecture. Bishkek started as a fort built in 1825 by the Uzbek Khan of Kokand. Its original purpose was to control local caravan routes and to collect tribute from Silk Road traders. The fort was captured by the Russians in 1862, which marked the beginning of significant Russian influence in the area.

DAY 6

ON THE TRAIN

JOURNEY THROUGH THE HISTORY OF CENTRAL ASIA

After breakfast, your train is leaving. Enjoy a relaxing day of lectures as your special train travels to Samarkand.

Rail travel in Central Asia began in the late 19th century during the Russian Empire's expansion. The first significant line, the Trans-Caspian Railway, was completed in the 1880s, connecting the Caspian Sea to Samarkand and later to Tashkent, fostering regional connectivity and Russian control.

Under Soviet rule, the network expanded, linking major cities across Central Asian republics and facilitating economic integration and resource distribution. Post-Soviet independence saw nationalisation and further development of these networks.

Today, rail remains vital for trade and travel across Central Asia, with modern projects enhancing connections within the region and beyond, notably into China and Europe.

EXPLORE THIS CROSSROAD OF CULTURE - A HIGHLIGHT OF UZBEKISTAN

Today, you will experience the sights of this renowned and historic site, which was known under the rule of Timur as the most beautiful and important city in the world: the burial town of Shah-i-Zinda ("The Living King"), the excavation sites of Afrasiyab (with museum tour) and Registan Square were certainly the most impressive construction ensemble in Central Asia.

Registan Square is surrounded by three mighty madrasas. The huge and magnificent portals impressive in terms of decoration and colour.

In the background, the domes of the mosques glitter like in the Middle Eastern fairy tale. In 1917, the women of Uzbekistan burned their face veils at this historic site and embarked on a new era.

Here in Samarkand you will spend the next two nights in a mid-range hotel.

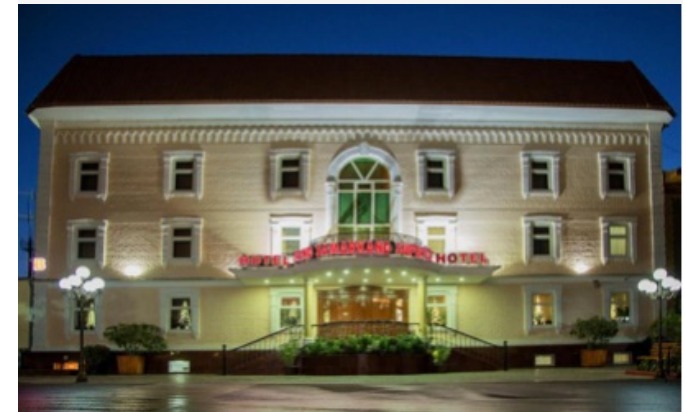

SAMARKAND

VISIT MORE OF THE CITY'S HISTORICAL & CULTURAL TREATS

Today, you visit a silk carpet manufactory and a Uzbek artisan family that makes paper from mulberry tree bark, you will see the Ulugh Beg Observatory and the ruins of the Bibi-Khanym Mosque. The palace-like Gur-i-Amir mausoleum complex can be visited from the inside. It houses the tomb of Timur, who made his capital a paradise as a famous builder, but also went down in history as a feared conqueror.

Did you know? In the 14th century, the conqueror Tamerlane (Timur) made Samarkand the capital of his vast empire. Under his rule, the city flourished as a centre of learning and culture, attracting artisans and scholars from across Eurasia to contribute to its grandeur.

The Ulugh Beg Observatory in Samarkand was one of the most advanced astronomical observatories in the Islamic world. Built in the 15th century by the ruler and scientist Ulugh Beg, it was equipped to observe the stars and contributed significantly to the medieval understanding of astronomy.

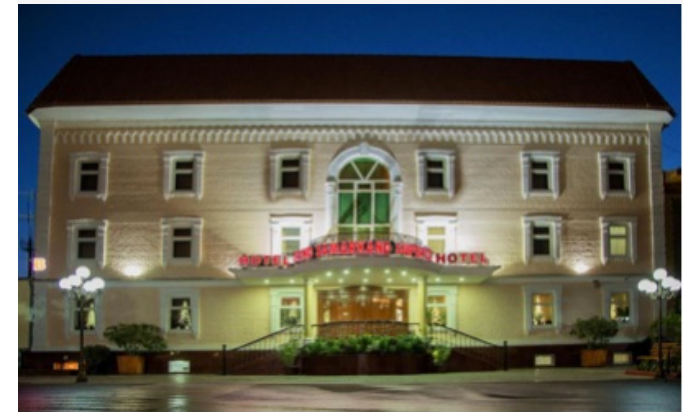

JOURNEY THROUGH THE HISTORY OF CENTRAL ASIA

After breakfast, your special train will continue on its way. Today, you will see a folklore show of the unique tradition of this region that seems to have fallen out of time. Afterwards you will go to Shahrissabz in the birthplace of Timur. In the evening, you travel with the special train to Dushanbe.

Did you know? Shahrissabz is famously known as the birthplace of Timur (Tamerlane), the 14th-century conqueror and founder of the Timurid Empire. The city holds significant historical importance due to its connection with Timur, who ordered the construction of many of the city's monumental buildings.

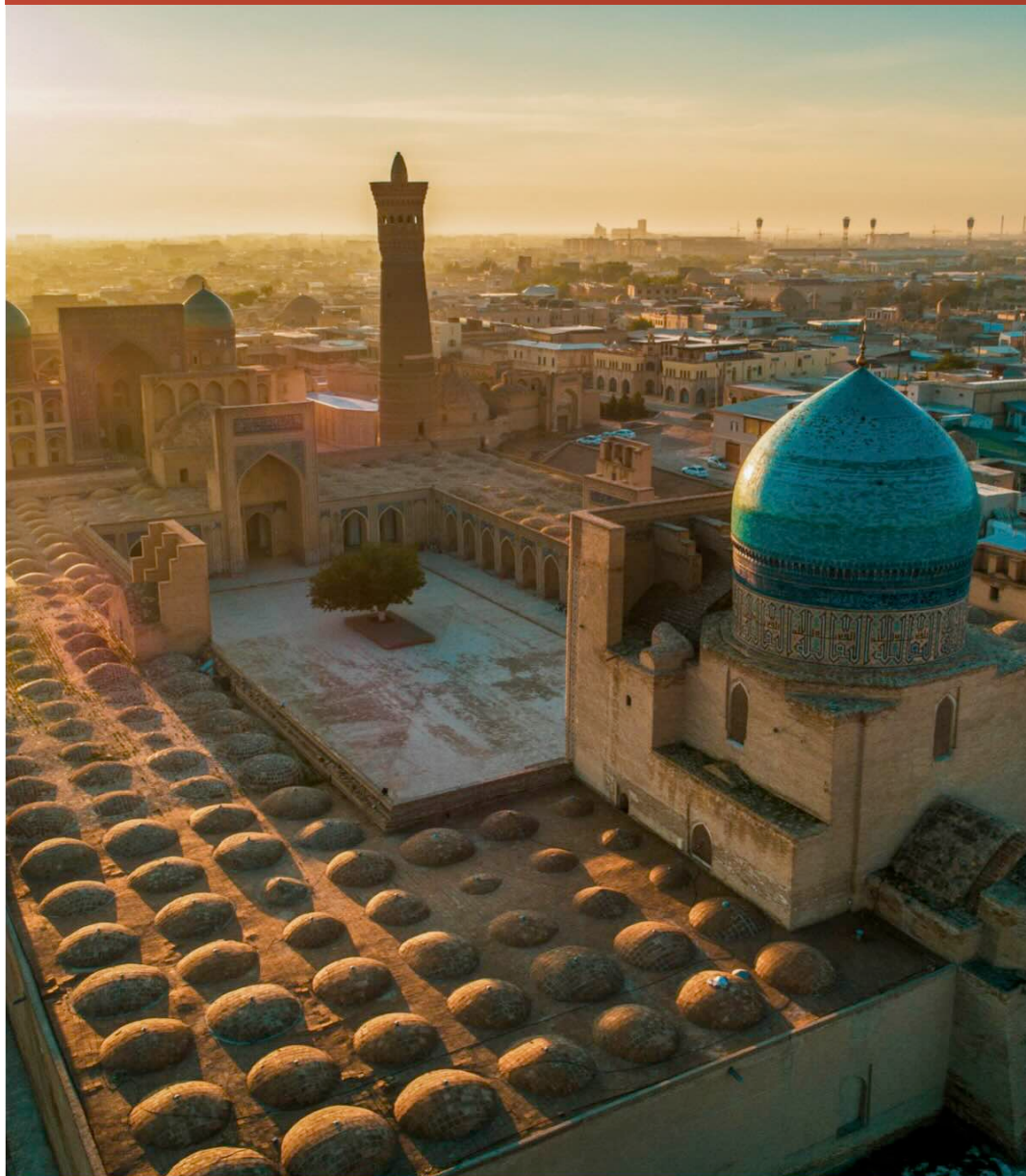

ARRIVE IN & EXPLORE THE CAPITAL OF TAJIKISTAN

After arriving in Dushanbe, the capital of Tajikistan, in the morning, you will discover numerous sights on a tour. Among the many parks in the city, a visit to Rudaki Park is a great way to relax in the countryside.

In the late afternoon you will return to your special train and head towards Bukhara.

Did you know? The name "Dushanbe" means "Monday" in Tajik, reflecting the city's origins as a small village that hosted a popular market every Monday. It wasn't until the 20th century that Dushanbe evolved from a small village into the major city and capital it is today.

THE ARCHITECTURAL TREAT OF UZBEKISTAN

Located in the middle of the Kyzylkum Desert, Bukhara has about one thousand monuments that recall the glory days of the Great Silk Road. In the old town you can see the almost 50 m high Kalyan minaret and the Lab-i Hauz ensemble at the pond. In front of the Nasreddin monument listen to some of his stories and legends.

In the courtyard of a madrasa, you will experience a folklore show with music, local dances and a presentation of colourful national costumes. Overnight at a mid-range hotel in Bukhara.

Did you know? The Poi Kalon Architectural Complex is one of the iconic landmarks of Bukhara, consisting of the Kalon Minaret, Kalon Mosque, and Mir-i-Arab Madrasah. The Kalon Minaret, also known as the "Tower of Death," was used historically as an execution method, where condemned prisoners were thrown from the top.

Today, visit the Khiva Oasis, from one of the best-known fairy tales from 1001 Nights. You will stand in front of the mighty city wall of Khiva with its gates and bastions of clay bricks, you will think you've been transported to another world: Around the Kalta Minor Minaret, life still pulsates today just as it did in ancient times.

During a walking tour you can enjoy all the sights: Palaces, mosques, minarets, mausoleums and madrasas form one of the best-preserved ensembles of medieval Middle Eastern town planning.

Did you know? One of Khiva's most iconic landmarks is the Kalta Minor Minaret, renowned for its short stature and broad, ornate base. It was intended to be the tallest minaret in Central Asia, but construction halted after the death of its initiator, Mohammed Amin Khan, leaving it at just 29 meters of the planned 70-plus meters.

USEFUL INFORMATION ABOUT THE TOUR

HOW FAR IN ADVANCE DO I NEED TO BOOK ?

This train tour is an exclusive trip with very limited departures through the year. Consequently we strongly advise our clients to book as far in advance as possible to avoid disappointment. This particularly applies to the higher level cabins which there is strong demand for.

CAN YOU OBTAIN & ADVISE ON THE VISAS FOR US ?

Visas (if required) can be quite complex so we recommend using a specialist visa agent and have an arrangement with [CIBT Visa Central](#) who offer a reliable service for all the visas you will need for your trip. Of course, we provide all the necessary documentation which must accompany your application.

ARE YOUR TOURS FINANCIALLY PROTECTED ?

Trips sold as packages to UK clients come with financial protection either through our ATOL if the trip includes a flight or insurances which comply with the UK package travel regulations for any trip that does not include a flight. In addition our ABTA membership means we must adhere to their strict code of conduct. Trips sold by us as an agent for train operator do not come with financial protection as even in the event of our insolvency your booking with the train operator would still exist and be honoured.

CAN YOU BOOK INTERNATIONAL FLIGHTS FOR US ?

Absolutely! Our ATOL license means that we can book international or indeed internal flights. We get particularly good access to the best deals on British Airways as we are an appointed operator. Just let us know which airports you want to fly from or to and we will be more than happy to give a quote.

IS THIS REGION SAFE TO TRAVEL IN ?

Many years back it had something of reputation but those times are long gone and the trip is now safe and trouble free for the vast majority of people. Your train is a private train so access is tightly controlled and our guides have your safety foremost in their minds throughout your trip with us.

CAN YOU BOOK FURTHER TRAVEL FOR US ?

Yes! We can offer excellent Moscow and St Petersburg programs as well as Trans-Siberian across Russia or to China. We also offer further rail adventures in Central Asia. Just ask us for details.

DO THE TRAINS HAVE PLUGS FOR RECHARGING?

The sockets in the train are standard two-pole Euro-plug sockets, but they are sometimes different in the hotels. If you want to be absolutely sure, you should bring along an Eastern European plug adaptor and one for China too, if necessary. Only Category III VI & V have sockets in the cabins - please check the voltage with your tour guide. Each carriage will have 220 V AC sockets available for charging. Mobile coverage is mostly good along the route. Check with your service provider for charges.

LUGGAGE & CLOTHING TO BRING

We strongly recommend travel bags rather than hard shelled suitcases for this trip as the latter are hard to handle and stow away on the train. The dress code is casual throughout the trip. We recommend sturdy shoes for excursions and you can expect chilly nights even in summer. When visiting churches you should dress modestly and women are expected to cover their heads with a scarf.

USEFUL INFORMATION ABOUT THE TOUR

AIR CONDITIONING

The train is air-conditioned with some cabins being centrally controlled while the higher class cabins have their own independent systems. Note that the air-conditioning only works when the train is moving above 30km / hour.

CONDUCTORS

Each carriage has two dedicated conductors there 24 hours a day to look after you.

TIPPING

Tipping is always appreciated by our the people looking after you on the trip. Of course, any tipping is entirely up to you and should only be given for exceptionally good service. Final documents will include detailed information on who to tip as well as recommendations as to how much.

HOTEL CHECK-IN

Hotel check-in time is 2pm and check out by midday. Occasionally early check-in may be possible although this cannot be guaranteed.

MEDICAL & HEALTH

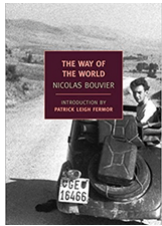
There are no particular vaccination requirements for this trip although we recommend you consult your doctor for final advice. The train will have a doctor on board. Fees are payable to the doctor and you will need to claim on your travel insurance after the trip.

TOILETS, WASHING & LAUNDRY

Small towels and sheeting is provided. Depending on your cabin class you will either have in cabin facilities or shared, end of carriage facilities. Opportunities for laundry are offered through the hotels and payable locally to them.

DINING CAR & DRINKS

Drinks are sold in both the dining car and by the conductors in your carriage. Payment is in Euros or US Dollars. Your conductor can provide you with hot or cold water. Drinks bought in the dining car are done so on a tab which is settled by you at the end of your trip. You must let us know of any dietary requirements before your trip starts.

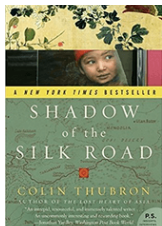

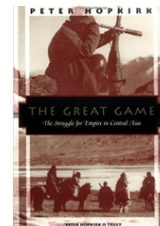
