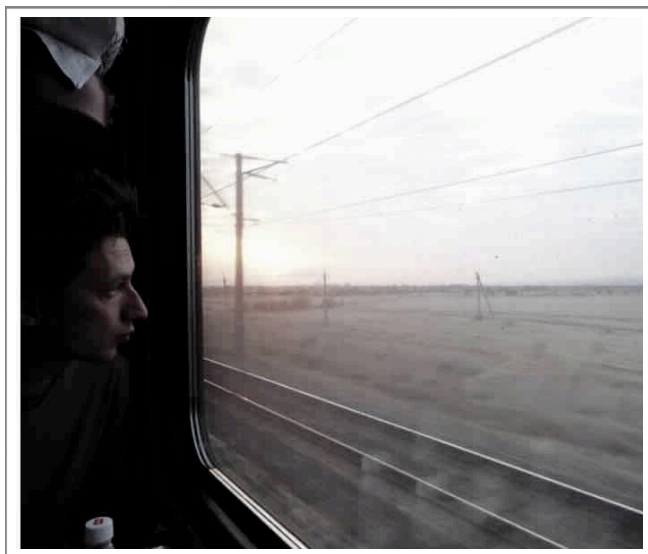

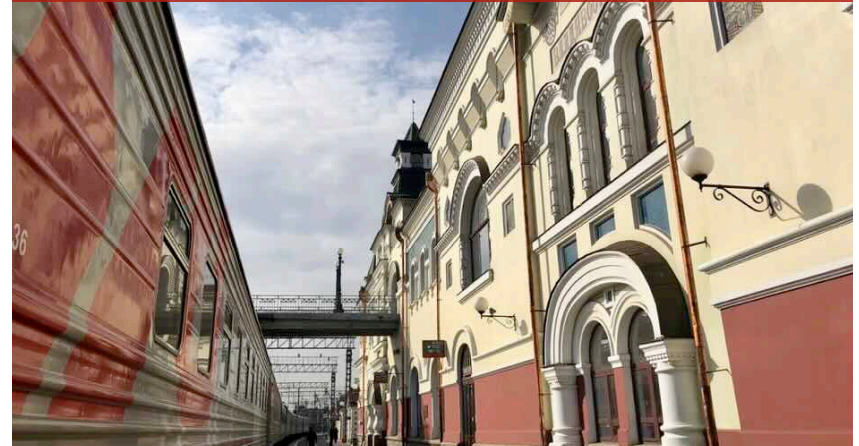

YOUR DETAILED DAY BY DAY ITINERARY

DAY 2

VLADIVOSTOK

- Half day tour of the city's highlights & afternoon departure Westbound.

This classic city tour of Vladivostok offers a comprehensive introduction to the city's most iconic landmarks and attractions. Highlights include the Tokarevsky Lighthouse, one of Vladivostok's most recognisable symbols, and the Vladivostok Railway Station, the eastern terminus of the legendary Trans-Siberian Railway. Visitors will also see the Marine Passenger Terminal, the bustling Central Square, and stroll down Svetlanskaya Street, lined with beautiful historical buildings. The tour features the elegant Nikolai Triumph Arch, the historic Korabelnaya Quay—the site where the city was founded over 150 years ago—and the C-56 Submarine Museum, where entry is included.

The experience continues with a ride on the city's well-known Vladivostok Funicular, offering a charming and practical way to explore the steep hills. A stop at a panoramic viewpoint provides sweeping views of the city and Golden Horn Bay. Throughout the tour, participants will pass numerous other cultural, architectural, and historical sites that contribute to Vladivostok's unique character and rich heritage. With its blend of maritime history, Russian imperial architecture, and Soviet-era landmarks, this tour captures the essence of Vladivostok in just a few engaging hours.

After the tour a transfer to the station for your first train Eastbound leaving behind its Pacific coastline and bustling port. The train winds its way north, crossing rolling hills and dense forests, with occasional glimpses of the Amur and Ussuri Rivers. Settlements grow sparse as the train pushes into the Russian wilderness, where small villages with wooden izbas dot the landscape.

DAY 3

ON THE TRAIN

- Across the Amur Region passing Khabarovsk and Birobidzhan.

By morning, the train arrives in Khabarovsk, a major city on the Amur River. The Amur River Bridge, spanning over 2.6 km, provides stunning views of the vast, meandering waterway. The stop allows passengers to step onto the platform, soaking in the bustling atmosphere of vendors selling fresh pastries, smoked fish, and hot tea. Departing Khabarovsk, the train follows the Amur River, marking Russia's natural border with China, before reaching Birobidzhan, capital of the Jewish Autonomous Region, where signs in Yiddish and Russian recall its unique past.

As the train moves west, the scenery shifts to dense forests, vast plains, and rolling hills, interrupted only by small wooden villages. Life on board settles into a comfortable rhythm—passengers sip black tea from glass holders, read, or gaze at the endless wilderness outside. By night, the train presses on through Siberia's boundless landscape.

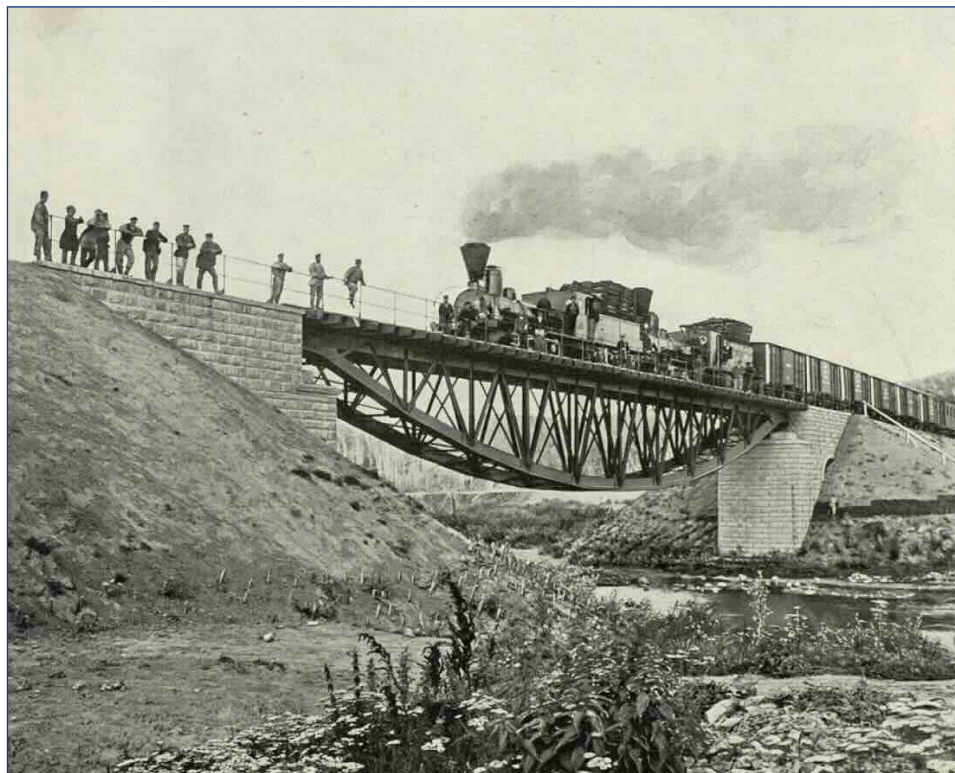
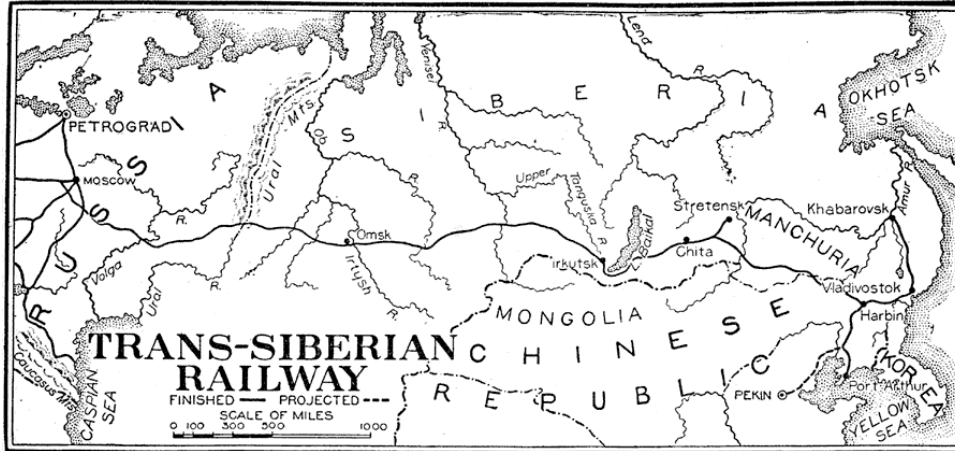
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THE BUILDING OF THE TRANS-SIBERIAN



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- The construction faced numerous geographical challenges, including crossing mountains, forests, and swamps. For example, engineers had to build bridges across major rivers like the Ob and Amur, and deal with the extreme cold of Siberian winters.
- Before the railway line around Lake Baikal was completed, trains had to be loaded onto ferries to cross the lake. A special icebreaker ferry, the Baikal, was built to operate in winter when the lake froze.
- The Amur Bridge near Khabarovsk, completed in 1916, was the final piece of the Trans-Siberian puzzle, linking the entire route without interruption. It spans 2.6 kilometres (1.6 miles) and was one of the most challenging engineering feats of the project.
- The construction of the Trans-Siberian Railway was extremely expensive and was partly funded by international loans, especially from France. The railway was seen as a crucial strategic asset to expand Russian influence in the Far East.
- The Trans-Siberian Railway has been continually modernised. The electrification of the railway started in 1929 and was completed in 2002, allowing for faster and more efficient trains to operate on the line.

DAY 4

ON THE TRAIN

- Continue Eastbound entering Siberia passing Chita and Zabaykalsky Krai.

By dawn, the train reaches Zabaykalsky Krai, where lush forests give way to rocky plains, grassy steppe, and scattered birch groves. Arriving in Chita, passengers glimpse a city steeped in history—once home to Decembrist exiles and later a Soviet military hub. The station is surrounded by Soviet-era buildings, Orthodox churches, and bustling markets, offering a glimpse of life in this remote Siberian outpost.

Departing Chita, the landscape becomes increasingly wild and uninhabited, with rolling hills, meandering rivers, and abandoned Soviet-era factories passing by. The train slows as it crosses wooden trestle bridges, offering views of fast-flowing streams cutting through the remote Siberian terrain. The sheer vastness of Siberia is striking—hours pass without a sign of human habitation. As night falls, the train continues its journey through endless forests and steppe, its rhythmic clatter lulling passengers into sleep as they edge closer to Lake Baikal.

DAY 5

IRKUTSK

- **Pass Ulan Ude & along the shores of Lake Baikal to Irkutsk.**

Today is usually the scenic highlight of the entire journey, a day of lake, forest and mountain views. Early in the morning you reach Ulan Ude before joining the main Trans-Siberian line on to Moscow. Later in the day the train rumbles around the Southern shore of stunning Lake Baikal often passing within a matter of meters of the lake and providing endlessly changing vistas.

Afternoon arrival in Irkutsk, regarded as the modern day cultural capital of Siberia, famed for its traditional wooden architecture.

Transfer to your hotel and once settled and once you've settled in, begin a leisurely two-hour walking tour of the city centre, exploring Irkutsk's rich history and architecture. Your tour will take you through the central park, where you can visit the War Memorial, a solemn tribute to fallen soldiers. Along the Angara River, admire several of the city's beautiful churches, showcasing Irkutsk's architectural diversity and spiritual heritage.

A highlight of the tour is a stop at the statue of Alexander III, the Russian tsar credited with the construction of the Trans-Siberian Railway, which played a key role in connecting Siberia with the rest of Russia.

After the tour, return to your hotel, where you'll have the rest of the day. You can visit local cafés, discover nearby museums, or enjoy a peaceful evening walk along the riverside to soak in more of Irkutsk's unique atmosphere.

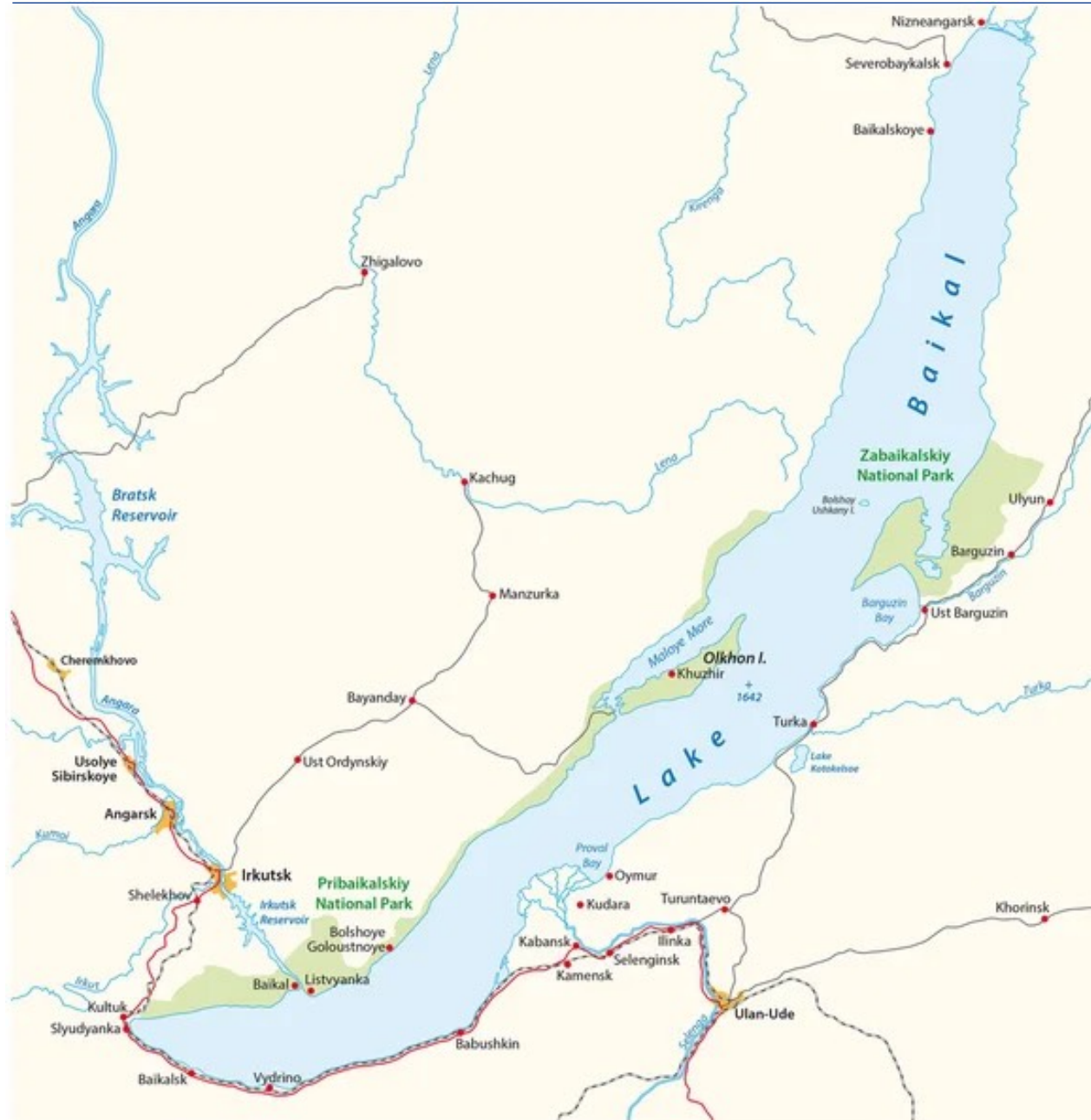

LAKE BAIKAL - DID YOU KNOW ?

- Lake Baikal is the world's oldest freshwater lake, estimated to be around 25-30 million years old. Its age makes it a unique natural laboratory for studying evolution and geological processes.
- With a depth of 1,642 meters (5,387 feet), Lake Baikal is the deepest lake in the world, holding about 20% of the world's unfrozen freshwater supply.
- The lake hosts over 3,700 species of plants and animals, two-thirds of which are endemic, meaning they can't be found anywhere else. The most famous is the Baikal seal (nerpa), the only freshwater seal species in the world.
- The water in Lake Baikal is incredibly clear, especially during winter. In some areas, you can see up to 40 meters (131 feet) down into the lake.
- Lake Baikal is a rift lake, formed due to tectonic plate movements. It's still expanding, at a rate of about 2 cm (0.8 inches) per year, meaning it could eventually become an ocean over millions of years.
- During the winter, the lake freezes over, and its ice can reach up to 1.5 meters thick. The ice is so transparent that people can see fish and plant life beneath it.
- For centuries, Lake Baikal has been considered sacred by indigenous people, especially the Buryat population.



YOUR DETAILED DAY BY DAY ITINERARY

DAY 6

LAKE BAIKAL

- **Transfer to Lake Baikal & a tour of the village of Listvyanka.**

After breakfast your guide will meet you for a transfer from the 1 hour drive following the route of the Angara River down to the village of Listvyanka located close to where the river meets beautiful Lake Baikal. The lake is among the deepest in the world at 1,642 meters and has exceptionally clear water - or perhaps ice when you are here!

On the way visit the Taltsi Museum of Wooden Architecture showcasing Siberian heritage through a collection of historic wooden buildings. Nestled along the Angara River, it offers visitors a glimpse into the traditional lives of indigenous Siberian peoples, Cossacks, and settlers, featuring reconstructed homes, fortresses, and a picturesque setting in nature.

On arrival in Listvyanka your guide will take you on a 4 hour walking tour including the beautiful church and Limnological Museum to learn about the Lake itself and its unique flora and fauna. We also take chairlift up to a view point for some of the best lake vistas. If time we can also visit the local fish market before a checking in to your hotel for with a free evening.

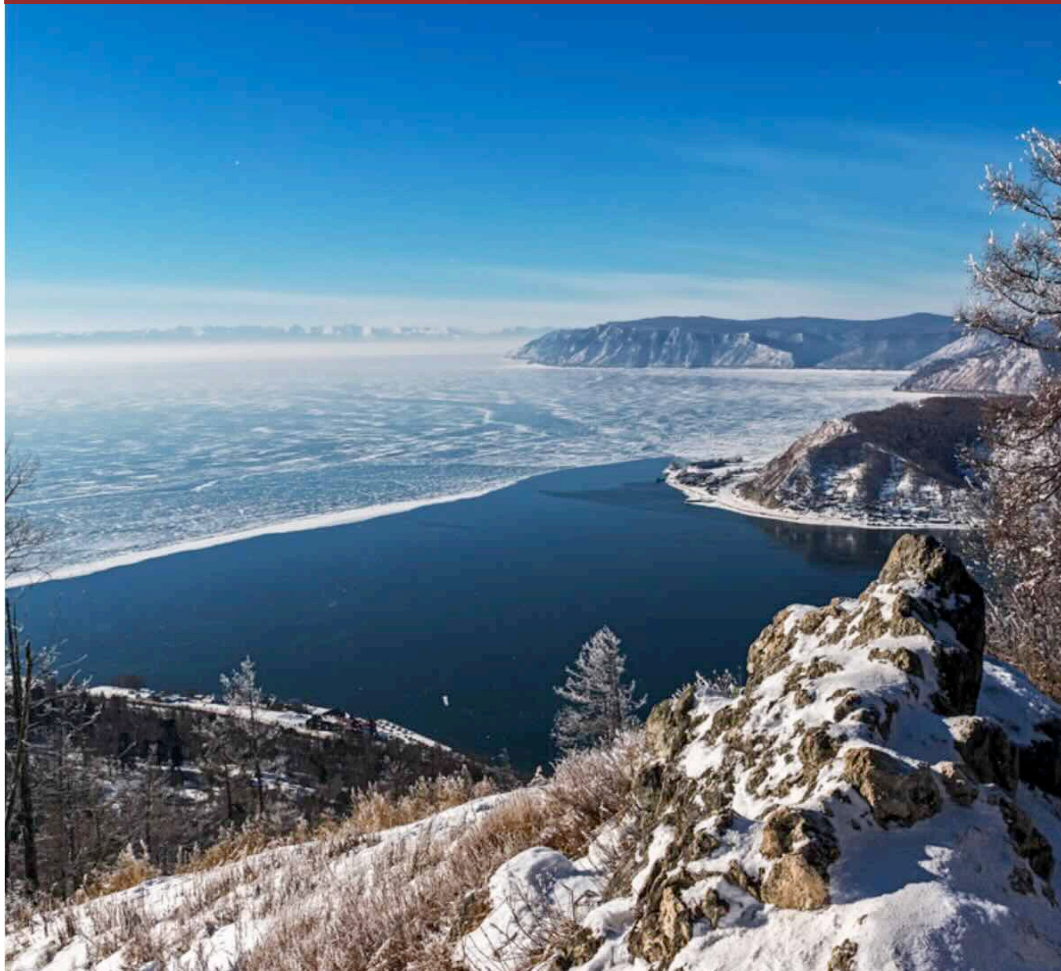

DAY 7

LAKE BAIKAL

- A free day in Listvyanka where you can partake in winter activities or relax.

Today is free to enjoy the lake and village. Perhaps start the day with an exhilarating dog sledding ride through the snowy Siberian forests, guided by expert mushers. For a faster-paced experience, rent a snowmobile and explore the icy landscapes.

Lake Baikal's frozen surface (mid-January to mid-March), known for its crystal-clear ice, provides the perfect setting for ice skating—you can glide over the world's deepest lake and even see cracks and bubbles trapped beneath the surface. If you seek more adrenaline, try an ice hovercraft tour, skimming effortlessly over the frozen lake while enjoying panoramic views.

For the truly adventurous, ice diving beneath Baikal's thick ice layers offers a surreal underwater experience, revealing the lake's unique aquatic life. If you prefer a scenic winter walk, hike to Chersky Stone, a viewpoint offering breathtaking vistas over the lake and surrounding mountains.

After an active day, warm up in a traditional Russian banya (sauna) and relax with a cup of local Siberian tea. End the day with a meal featuring smoked omul fish, a Baikal delicacy, making your winter escape to Listvyanka truly unforgettable.

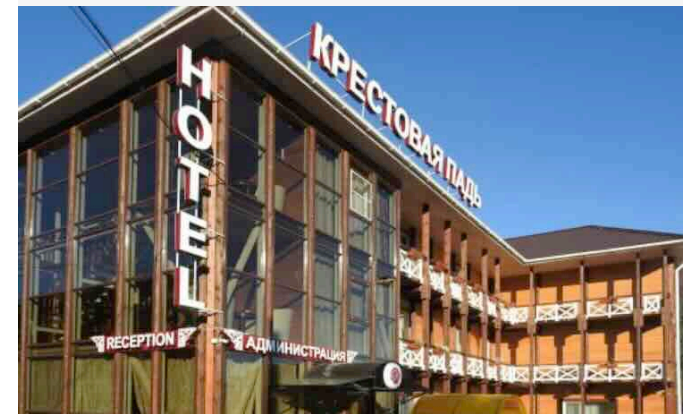

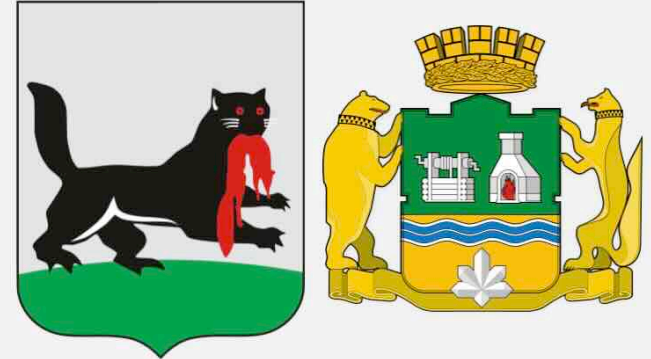
Free time in the village this morning before a returning to Irkutsk to catch your onward train Westbound.

TYPICAL RUSSIAN DINING CAR DISHES

- **Solyanka Солянка:** A hearty and sour soup with a mix of meat, pickles, and spices.
- **Shchi Щи:** A cabbage-based soup, often served with sour cream.
- **Pirozhki Пирожки:** Small baked or fried buns filled with meat, potatoes, cabbage, or sweet fillings like jam.
- **Borscht Борщ:** A traditional beet soup served hot, often with sour cream and sometimes accompanied by bread or a meat cutlet.
- **Pelmeni Пельмени:** Russian dumplings filled with meat, usually served with sour cream or butter.
- **Kasha Каша:** A type of porridge made from grains like buckwheat or oats, often served for breakfast.
- **Blini Блины:** Thin Russian pancakes, often served with fillings like jam, sour cream, or caviar.
- **Kotleti Котлеты:** Meat patties made from minced beef or chicken, typically served with mashed potatoes or rice.
- **Russian Tea & Sweets Русский чай и сладости:** Hot tea served in podstakannik (a metal tea glass holder), typically accompanied by cookies, chocolates, or small cakes.

Introduction: Dining on the Trans-Siberian Railway is a blend of onboard meals, platform food, and self-prepared options.

Supermarkets: Many passengers prefer to bring their own provisions from supermarkets before boarding. 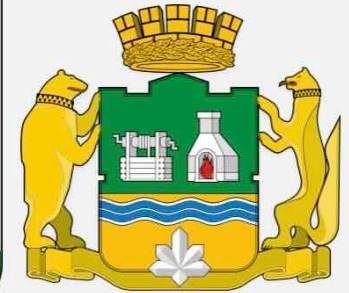

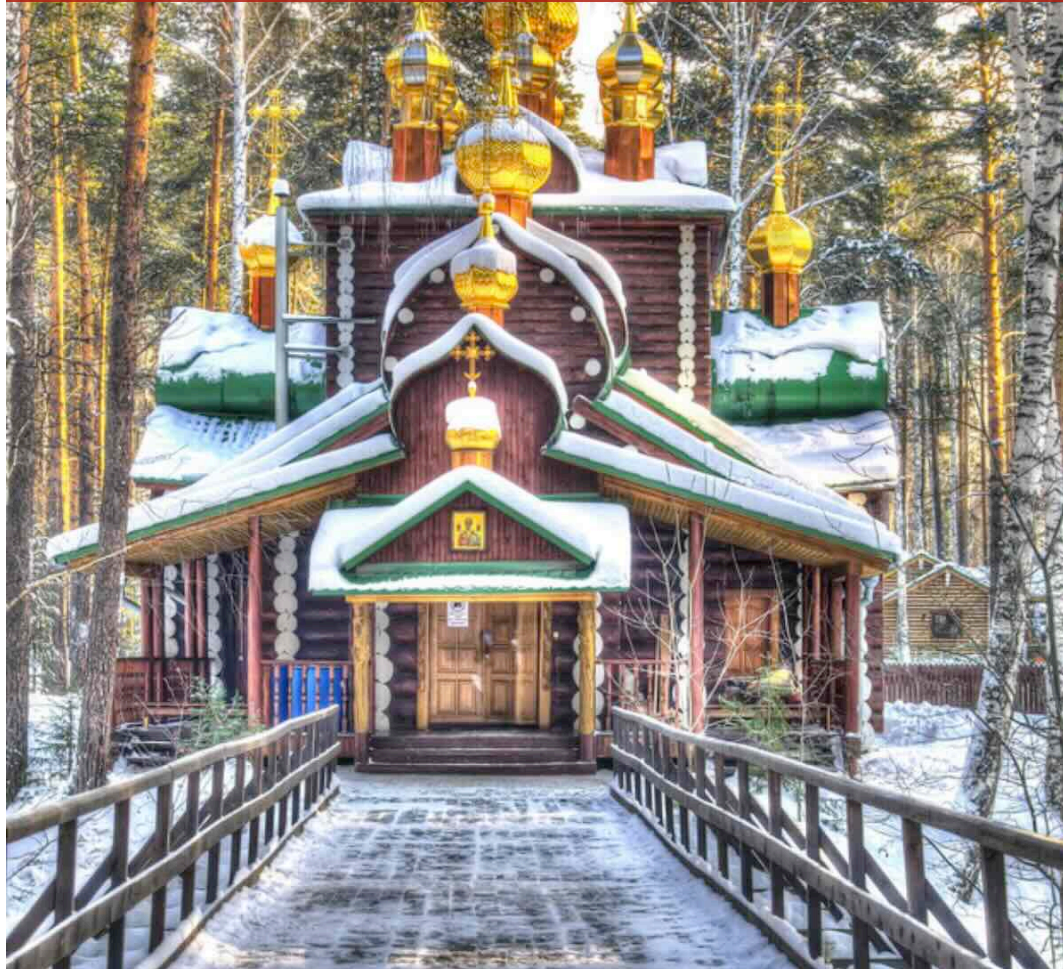

DAY 11

EKATERINBURG

- City tour, Romanov's secret graves & the Europe Asia border.

This morning your guide will take you on a 3 hour walking tour of the city's highlights. Stop at the central square and see statues of Ekaterinburg's founders and leaders and learn local stories, legends (and a few jokes!) related to them. Continue to the 1905 Revolution square before the most compelling story will be told at the beautiful Church of Spilled Blood located at the Romanovs' Death Site and Chapel of St Elizabeth. See views from the Hill of Ascension and visit the powerful Afghanistan memorial at the Square of the Red Army.

After lunch (own arrangement) drive 15 km north-west to a monastery dedicated to the Romanov's family located on the spot where the Bolsheviks tried to hide the corpses of the Tsar and his family in a secret grave.

Continue on to the continental border of Europe and Asia 20 km west of the city. On the way we make a short stop at the Memorial of Victims of the GULAGs. The Main Obelisk "Between Europe & Asia" allows you to straddle the continental divide and you also get a Certificate with a glass of sparkling wine!

Return to the city with free time for the rest of the day.

The Romanov dynasty ruled Russia for over 300 years, from 1613 to 1917, beginning with Mikhail Romanov and ending with Nicholas II. The family came to power during a time of unrest known as the Time of Troubles, and Mikhail Romanov was elected Tsar in 1613, restoring stability to the country.

Over the centuries, the Romanovs expanded Russia into a vast empire. Under rulers like Peter the Great and Catherine the Great, the empire modernised, engaged with Europe, and grew in power. Peter introduced Western reforms and established St. Petersburg, while Catherine expanded Russia's territory and promoted culture.

The last Romanov tsar, Nicholas II, ascended the throne in 1894. His reign saw significant challenges, including the Russo-Japanese War (1904-1905), Bloody Sunday (1905), and the Russian Revolution of 1905. Despite efforts at reform, discontent grew. The Bolshevik Revolution in 1917 led to Nicholas abdicating the throne.

In 1918, the Bolsheviks executed Nicholas II, his wife Alexandra, and their five children, ending the Romanov dynasty. The family's downfall was due to political unrest, social inequality, and failure to adapt to the changing political climate, marking the end of imperial Russia.

THE ROMANOVS IN EKATERINBURG - A TIMELINE

- April 30, 1918: The Romanov family — Tsar Nicholas II, Tsarina Alexandra, and their five children — arrived in Ekaterinburg after being transferred from Tobolsk by the Bolsheviks.
- They were imprisoned in the Ipatiev House, also known as the “House of Special Purpose.” The house was heavily guarded, and the family's movements were restricted.
- The Romanovs were confined to two rooms. Their personal freedoms and comforts gradually diminished; they were forbidden from interacting with guards and could only go outside for limited walks.
- Heightened Security: In June 1918, the Bolsheviks increased the security around Ipatiev House. Windows were boarded up, and outside communications were cut off, signalling the impending end.
- Bolshevik leaders feared a possible rescue attempt by the advancing White Army, which prompted them to consider the execution of the Romanov family to prevent their liberation.
- July 16, 1918: The Bolsheviks received orders from Moscow to execute the Romanov family, concerned over White Army movements in the region.
- The bodies were initially buried in a shallow grave in the Koptyaki Forest, near Ekaterinburg. The burial site remained a secret for decades.
- In 1991, the Romanov family's remains were discovered, identified through DNA testing, and reburied in St. Petersburg in 1998.

DAY 12

EKATERINBURG

- Learn dogsledding in the winter forest and enjoy a Russian banya.

After a good breakfast you will be picked up at your hotel by our expert in dog sledging and driven to an area to the west of the city. Here you meet the real Siberian 'Khaski' dogs who will be pulling your traditional sledge for 7 km through the beautiful ice encrusted winter forest. Full instruction will be given and whilst sledging there is a back up vehicle. Picnic lunch in the forest before returning to Ekaterinburg.

The perfect way to relax after the exertion and cold of sledging is with 2 hours in the steam bath known as a "Banya", one of the great Russian traditions. Your guide will instruct you in the etiquette and method of using the facilities including the tradition of being beaten with birch branches!

NOTE: Dogsledding available from the 15th November to 1st March excluding the period of the 31st December to 10th January.

DAY 14

MOSCOW

- Arrival in Russia's Capital & tour the Kremlin & Armoury, Metro & Red Square.

Morning arrival at Moscow's large Yaroslavsky station where a driver will be meeting you to transfer you to the hotel to meet your guide. It is unlikely you can check in this early but your luggage will be stored.

Moscow, founded in 1147, grew from a small medieval town to the political and cultural heart of Russia. It became the capital in 1547 under Ivan the Terrible, survived invasions like Napoleon's in 1812, and transformed into a global power hub during Soviet rule, retaining its status today as Russia's capital.

Start a tour of Moscow which begins with a visit to Red Square, where you'll see iconic sites like St. Basil's Cathedral and the Lenin Mausoleum. Next, head to the Kremlin for a guided tour of its historic cathedrals, palaces, and the Armoury Museum, showcasing royal treasures, Fabergé eggs, and ceremonial weaponry.

In the afternoon, dive into the architectural beauty of the Moscow Metro, known for its opulent, museum-like stations such as Komsomolskaya and Mayakovskaya. VACCINATIONS

Vaccinations are generally not required for entry into Russia, but it is recommended to be up-to-date on routine vaccines like MMR (measles, mumps, rubella), diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis, and influenza. Additional vaccines to consider based on your activities and areas of travel include Hepatitis A (for food and water safety), Hepatitis B, Rabies (especially for rural areas), and Tick-borne Encephalitis if you plan to hike or camp in forested regions during the spring or summer.

VISAS

Citizens from the United States, Canada, the UK, and EU, typically need a tourist visa to visit Russia. The visa application process requires an invitation letter (also known as a visa support document), a completed visa application form, a valid passport (with at least six months remaining after the visa expires), a passport-sized photo, and proof of travel insurance. Processing can take from a few days to several weeks, depending on the country and service chosen. This [Wikipedia link](#) is useful.

WHEN TO VISIT

The best time to travel the Trans-Siberian Railway is late spring (May) or early autumn (September), when temperatures are mild, and landscapes are at their most scenic, with blooming flowers or vibrant fall colours. These months avoid the extreme cold of winter and the summer tourist season. June to August is also pleasant but busier, while winter (December to February) offers a magical snow-covered journey, though temperatures can drop below -20°C.

ELECTRICITY & PLUGS

Russia uses 220V, 50Hz electricity. Plugs are Type C (European) and Type F, both with two round pins. These are standard in most European countries.

MONEY TO TAKE

When visiting Russia, it's useful to carry Russian rubles (RUB) for smaller purchases, especially in rural areas. Major cities like Moscow and Saint Petersburg widely accept credit and debit cards. ATMs are readily available for cash withdrawals, and Visa and MasterCard are the most commonly accepted cards. It's advisable to exchange some currency before arrival or use ATMs for rubles. Inform your bank about your trip to avoid card issues abroad.





HOW FAR IN ADVANCE DO I NEED TO BOOK?

The Trans-Siberian can be quite a complex trip with a definite peak season when tickets and good hotel rooms can become scarce so we recommend booking as far in advance as possible if you are travelling from June to the end of September. Outside of this period we still recommend booking at least 2 months in advance to allow plenty of time to obtain the visas.

CAN YOU OBTAIN THE VISAS FOR US?

We have a partnership with the visa agents [CIBT Visa Central](#) who will guide you through the visa application process. As you are likely to be obtaining more than one visa for a Trans-Siberian trip it makes sense to make use of a specialised visa agent who will do the leg work running between the various embassies.

WHAT IS THE BEST TIME OF YEAR TO TRAVEL?

The summer months from June to the end of August are generally considered the best and are certainly the busiest. However, catching the Autumn colours from early September is probably our favourite time to visit Russia although Mongolia can already be cold. China tends to be best in September and October although do try and avoid the week long National Day holiday during the 1st week of October. Don't forget that Siberia looks stunning in winter!

DO YOU HAVE FINANCIAL PROTECTION?

IS IT WORTH TRAVELLING IN WINTER?

Oh Yes! Siberia looks amazing, a ger stay in Mongolia is the definition of cosy and Beijing is cold but dry and sunny. All three countries are very used to dealing with winter making the experience more comfortable than you might think.

DO THE TRAINS HAVE PLUGS FOR RECHARGING?

As a rule, yes although if there are 4 of you in a cabin you will need to take turns - or bring an extension plug! You can also ask your provodnitsas nicely if you can use her plugs but that will depend on the individual and they may expect a tip for this.

IS TRANS-SIBERIAN TRAVEL SAFE?

Yes! In recent years we hear of very few problems either on the stops or the trains and there is no reason why you should not feel as safe if not safer than if travelling in your home country. This applies to men or women traveling alone and exercising reasonable common sense.





WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN FIRST & SECOND CLASS?

First and second class cabins are the same size and tend to have similar facilities with the only real but big difference being that 2nd class cabins have 4 berths and first class 2 berths. So a couple get privacy and space in first class. A first class carriage will also have less competition for bathroom although this is not usually a big issue or a particular reason to go first class. Second class is arguably more social.

WHAT HAPPENS ONCE WE MAKE A BOOKING?

On taking a booking we will confirm as many of the services as can be at that point and then ask you for a non-refundable deposit of 20% per person plus any international flights we are booking with the final balance payment due 60 days before your trip start date with us. On booking we will also offer advice about obtaining the visas and about 1 month before your trip with us starts we will send you our exclusive Trip Guidebook tailored to your specific trip with us.

CAN YOU BOOK INTERNATIONAL FLIGHTS ?

Yes, as we hold an ATOL license (number 10287) we are permitted by the Civil Aviation Authority in the UK to book flights on behalf of our clients. We are a British Airways preferred operator but also book with other airlines to get the best deals and routes for our clients.

WILL MY PHONE WORK ?

Yes and you will find coverage is surprisingly good all the way along the train routes and in cities. If you buy a SIM card make sure you are buying for the right phone system as some mobile companies in Mongolia, for example, operate on GSM (same as UK, Europe) and others CDMA (North America and Japan). You should also check what roaming charges will be with your mobile provider.
